



#### NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Leader We pray for the concerns of our community; for the Transition Committee and the parish staff, as they prepare for new leadership; for new immigrants who are being integrated into a new country and community; for all who are learning languages to better bridge the cultures.

Leader We pray for all those who suffer and for those in any trouble; for anyone in the hospital, and for those living with mental illness; for any who are estranged from family; for loved ones in care homes and for those in hospice.

Leader We pray for those who have departed this life, especially, Colleen Green, the mother of Helen Crandell; and those whom we name silently or aloud...



## PRAYERS FOR AN INCLUSIVE CHURCH





Presider

#### THE LORD'S PRAYER


Presider As our Savior Christ has taught us, we now pray,


## COMMUNION ANTHEM


#### PRAYER FOR MISSION AND MINISTRY


