NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.



The Presider continues

Glory and honor and praise to you, holy and living God. To deliver us from the power of sin and death and to reveal the riches of your grace, you looked with favor upon Mary, your willing servant, that she might conceive and bear a son, Jesus the holy child of God. Living among us, Jesus loved us. He broke bread with outcasts and sinners, healed the sick, and proclaimed good news to the poor. THE LORD'S PRAYER


Presider As our Savior Christ has taught us, we now pray,





Asylum-seekers staying in St. Michael's House

With the support of the St. Michael's Vestry and clergy, members of the IWC helped a family move into St. Michael's House. Freddy Castillo, a member of the 1:00 service, is one of the *Nicaragua 222*, political prisoners who were released from prison and brought to the U.S. by the State Department on February 9, 2023. He was joined first by his wife Karol and two of his children Brittany and Marcelo, and their third son Frelldyn arrived last week.

IWC members have helped the family with many necessities, including signing up for health care and for library cards. They are participating in the 1:00 pm Misa. Freddy and his sons are helping out around the building, and Brittany and Marcelo are attending Latino youth camp next week (Marcelo as a counselor).
