





New Zealand Prayer Book

Guide us.

Leader:

Friends, we gather this morning, having seen images of, read about or heard of atrocities in our city, nation and the world in the last week or so. We grieve and pray for those who have been threatened, injured and killed and for those who love them. Many of us are fearful and anxious in spite of the fact that we trust that God loves us and has promised to never leave us alone. We ask ourselves what we can do to help end the hate and violence.

God of love,

Give us eyes to see, hearts to understand, and the courage and strength to do what you call us to do.

Leader: We pray for the Universal Church, its members and its mission, remembering especially; the clergy and people of St. Stephen, Newport; for our Presiding Bishop Michael, our Diocesan Bishop Diana; and our rector Scott and his family. God of love,

Guide us.

Leader: We pray for children who are homeless, many living on the street or placed in environments or with people who are not appropriate. Is this a problem that churches in our city are being called to work on with governmental and non-profit entities? God of love,

Guide us.

Leader: We again have many on our prayer list and in our lives outside the church who need our prayers. Let us pause for a few moments so that those of us here or online can offer prayers aloud or in our hearts for these dear ones. (*Pause*) God of love,

Guide us.

Presider: God of peace, let us your people know, that at the heart of turbulence there is an inner calm that comes from faith in you. Keep us from being content with things as they are, that from this central peace there may come a creative compassion, a thirst for justice, and a willingness to give of ourselves in the spirit of Christ.





Of your grace, you gave Jesus to be human, to share our life, to proclaim the coming of your holy reign and give himself for us, a fragrant offering.

Through Jesus Christ our Redeemer, you have freed us from sin, brought us into your life, reconciled us to you, and restored us to the glory you intend for us.

Presider As our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:


