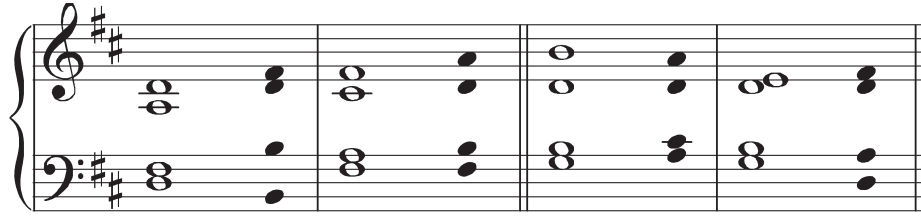

People: **Empower us to walk in the way of love, to welcome the excluded and care for the vulnerable, to work for justice, and rejoice in the spirit of life.**

Presider Holy One, as you have blessed us and heard our prayers: we pray you will now send us in your name. Help us to imagine your future and to work for it, encouraged by your word of hope. Strengthen us when we falter; offer us light when we cannot find our way. Grant us joy today as we celebrate, and fill us tomorrow with your love, your power, and your strength for the work at hand. Remind us that you are with us always. We pray in Jesus' name.

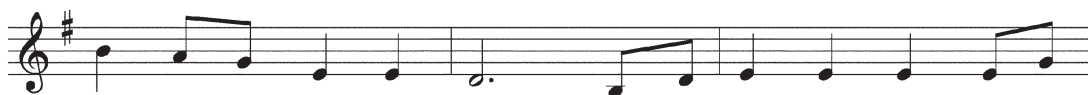

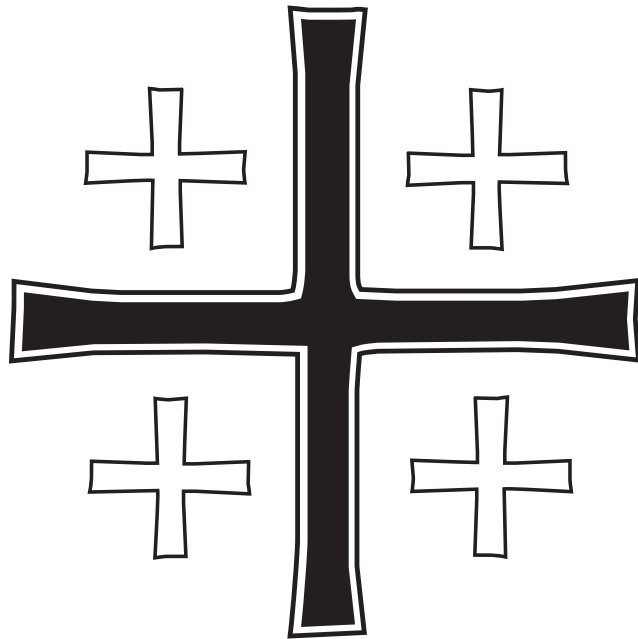

Music today and upcoming

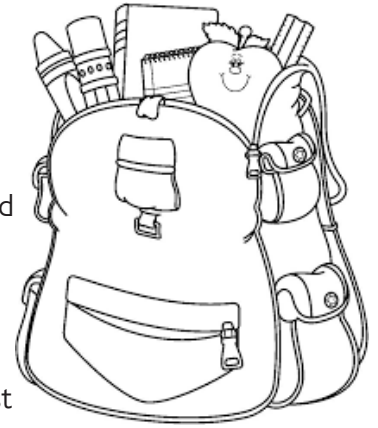
