





THE FIRST READING Genesis 28:10-19a read by Jan Clark




Paul teaches that, if we follow our lower nature, we are enslaved and destined to death, but when we are moved by God's Spirit, we become God's children and heirs with Christ.

SERMON

New Zealand Prayer Book

You, O God, are supreme and holy. You create our world and give us life. Your purpose overarches everything we do. You have always been with us. You are God.

You, O God, are infinitely generous, good beyond all measure. You came to us before we came to you. You have revealed and proved your love for us in Jesus Christ, who lived and died and rose again. You are with us now. You are God.

You, O God, are Holy Spirit. You empower us to be your gospel in the world. You reconcile and heal; you overcome death. You are our God. We worship you.

The Prayers of the People

- Presider: Life-creating and life-giving God: you gave us yourself and created everything that is; you sent Jesus to share our human nature and to show us who you are; and you gave us the abiding presence and wisdom of the Holy Spirit to guide us on our way. You invite us, as your people, to gather the world's needs into our hearts, bring them before you in prayer and then to fight for justice and peace with courage, imagination and creativity. For your love of all people, Hear our prayers.
- Leader: We have15 people on our prayer list this week and most of us also know others who need our prayers. Let us pause now for a few moments so that those of us here can offer prayers aloud or in our hearts for these dear ones. (*Pause*) For your love of all those in need of comfort and prayer, Hear our prayers.
- *Leader:* We pray for our nation and for all the nations. We see division, hate, greed and the lust for power threaten governments around the globe. War and threats of political violence here and abroad are realities of our lives, creating fear and anxiety. Show us how we can effectively join with others to make a difference for good in our spheres of influence. For your love of the nations,

Hear our prayers.

- *Leader:* As we experience high temperatures and risk of wildfires in Oregon and learn of extreme weather events elsewhere causing loss of life and property, we pray for strong leaders to guide us in becoming part of the climate change solution, not the problem. For your love of the earth, **Hear our prayers.**
- *Leader:* We pray for people discriminated against due to color, their faith or lack thereof, their being members of the LGBTQ+ community or because they are poor, homeless or addicted. Walking in the Pride Parade, It's in the Bag, Burrito Love, providing backpacks filled with school supplies for foster kids and other ways we serve folks in the community are excellent. But can we do more? Help us listen for the call to serve in new ways or with programs that were successful and important in the past. For your love of servant hands and hearts,

Hear our prayers.

Leader: We are grateful for the outpouring of joy, energy, love, and hope that the arrival of Scott as our rector, brother and friend has caused. We are thankful for the efforts he has made and continues to make to become acquainted with us all. We ask you to bless him, God, in his work, his family, home and times of relaxation and recreation. Presider: Life-giving God, pour out your spirit, strength and courage upon us, that we may hurry to make you welcome not only in our concern for others, but by serving them generously and faithfully in your name. Amen.



We thank you that on the night before he died for us Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, gave it to his friends and said: "Take, eat, this is my Body, broken for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper Jesus took the cup of wine, said the blessing, gave it to his friends and said: "Drink this, all of you: this cup is the new Covenant in my Blood, poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me."

And so, remembering all that was done for us: the cross, the tomb, the resurrection and ascension, longing for Christ's coming in glory, and presenting to you these gifts your earth has formed and human hands have made, we acclaim you, O Christ:

Presider As our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:






PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION




