WELCOME TO ST. MICHAEL'S

We manifest joy through vibrant worship, beautiful music, and the active participation and nurturing of our children and youth.

We embrace resilience by learning each other's stories, proclaiming the Good News of God's unconditional love, and strengthening our capacity to hope.

We seek justice by advocating for political change, continuing our work as an Immigrant Welcoming Congregation, and striving to understand our role in social, economic, and racial inequality.

We live in love through our Baptismal Promises to welcome and respect the dignity of every human being, care for God's creation, and engage in the ministry of Jesus to bring light, healing, and grace to our world.

We are rooted as an Episcopal Church, honoring our traditions from the creative perspective of our community, learning how to engage the bilingual and multicultural makeup of our congregation, and seeking silence and stillness to glean insight from the Holy Spirit among us.

St. Michael & All Angels, located in Multnomah County, rests on the traditional homelands of the Multnomah, Kathlamet, Clackamas, Molalla, Tumwater, Watlala bands of the Chinook, the Tualatin Kalapuya, and many other indigenous nations of the Columbia River. We acknowledge the ancestors of this place and understand that we are here because of the sacrifices forced upon them. By recognizing these communities, we honor their legacy, their lives, and their descendants.

Episcopal worship gathers the hearts and prayers of everyone present and involves call and response between the leader and the assembly. You'll find the responses of the community here, in bold type, marked "People."

Children are welcome here, voices and wiggles and all! The very young (infants to five years) are invited to play in our childcare room on the lower level, though some children prefer to remain in worship with their families. Early in the service, school-age children (generally, grades K-5) will be invited downstairs for their Liturgy of the Word, and they return to the gathered community before communion. Coloring and reading books for children are located at the back of the church.







PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATE

The People sit.

Presider The candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Parents and godparents now stand with the candidate.

Parents and Godparents:

I present Esther Kathryn to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

The Priest addresses the parents and godparents of the child to be baptized:

Presider Will you be responsible for seeing that she is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Answer I will, with God's help.

Presider Will you by your prayers and witness help her to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Answer I will, with God's help.

Then the Presider asks the following questions of the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the infant.

Presider Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer I renounce them.

Presider Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Presider Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Presider Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Answer I do.

Presider Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer I do.

Presider Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Answer I do.

The People stand, and the Priest addresses the congregation:

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Esther in his life in Christ?

People We will.

Presider Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal

covenant.

THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

Presider Do you believe in God the Father?

People I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Presider Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy

Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the

living and the dead.

Presider Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the

forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Presider Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the

prayers?

People I will, with God's help.

Presider Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People I will, with God's help.

Presider Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People I will, with God's help.

Presider Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People I will, with God's help.

Presider Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human

being?

People I will, with God's help.

PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATE

The People remain standing.

Presider Let us now pray for Esther, who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

A Person appointed leads the following petitions

Leader Deliver her O Lord from the way of sin and death.

People Lord hear our prayer.

Leader Open her heart to your grace and truth.

People Lord hear our prayer.

Leader Fill her with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

People Lord hear our prayer.

Leader Keep her in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

People Lord hear our prayer.

Leader Teach her to love others in the power of the Spirit.

People Lord hear our prayer.

Leader Send her into the world in witness to your love.

People Lord hear our prayer.

Leader Bring her to the fullness of your peace and glory.

People Lord hear our prayer.

The Presider says

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and forever. Amen.

THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

The priest blesses the water, first saying

Presider The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Presider Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Presider We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the

beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the

bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Presider touches the water

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. Amen.

People Amen.

THE BAPTISM

The family gathers around the baptismal font. The child is presented by name to the priest, who then pours water upon her, saying

Presider Esther Kathryn, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People Amen.

Presider Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. `.

The priest places a hand on the child's head, marking on the forehead, with the oil of chrism, the sign of the Cross, saying:

Presider Esther, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

People Amen.

The Priest then presents the child with a lighted candle.

Presider Esther, receive the light of Christ, and shine forth as Christ's light in the world.



Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.



By his blood, he reconciled us.


By his wounds, we are healed.





To share the cup, take hold of the base and guide it to your mouth. If not desiring to receive the wine, fold arms in an "x" over your chest as the cup passes by.



ART IN THE COLUMBARIUM ROOM


The Christus Rex ("Christ the King") was first installed on the chancel east wall in the remodel of the early 1970's and ultimately found its way to adorn the columbarium in the mid 1990's.

The Icon - Rublev's "Holy Trinity" based on Genesis 18 is a gift to St. Michaels from the Columbarium Team.

The iron sculpture of "The Last Supper" is Mexican, a gift from Deacon Marla McGarry Lawrence and Gary Lawrence.

The large bronze candle holders were made in Spain.

The wood statue of St. Michael on the lintel, overlooking the room, was purchased by John Scannell in a street market in Havana in 2000.
