WELCOME TO ST. MICHAEL'S

We manifest joy through vibrant worship, beautiful music, and the active participation and nurturing of our children and youth.

We embrace resilience by learning each other's stories, proclaiming the Good News of God's unconditional love, and strengthening our capacity to hope.

We seek justice by advocating for political change, continuing our work as an Immigrant Welcoming Congregation, and striving to understand our role in social, economic, and racial inequality.

We live in love through our Baptismal Promises to welcome and respect the dignity of every human being, care for God's creation, and engage in the ministry of Jesus to bring light, healing, and grace to our world.

We are rooted as an Episcopal Church, honoring our traditions from the creative perspective of our community, learning how to engage the bilingual and multicultural makeup of our congregation, and seeking silence and stillness to glean insight from the Holy Spirit among us.

St. Michael & All Angels, located in Multnomah County, rests on the traditional homelands of the Multnomah, Kathlamet, Clackamas, Molalla, Tumwater, Watlala bands of the Chinook, the Tualatin Kalapuya, and many other indigenous nations of the Columbia River. We acknowledge the ancestors of this place and understand that we are here because of the sacrifices forced upon them. By recognizing these communities, we honor their legacy, their lives, and their descendants.

Episcopal worship gathers the hearts and prayers of everyone present and involves call and response between the leader and the assembly. You'll find the responses of the community here, in bold type, marked "People."

Children are welcome here, voices and wiggles and all! The very young (infants to five years) are invited to play in our childcare room on the lower level, though some children prefer to remain in worship with their families. Early in the service, school-age children (generally, grades K-5) will be invited downstairs for their Liturgy of the Word, and they return to the gathered community before communion. Coloring and reading books for children are located at the back of the church.

THE READING Isaiah 40.1-11 (CEB)

Comfort, comfort my people! says your God.

Speak compassionately to Jerusalem,

and proclaim to her that her compulsory service has ended, that her penalty has been paid,

that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins!

A voice is crying out:

"Clear the Lord's way in the desert!

Make a level highway in the wilderness for our God!

Every valley will be raised up,

and every mountain and hill will be flattened.

Uneven ground will become level, and rough terrain a valley plain.

The Lord's glory will appear, and all humanity will see it together; the Lord's mouth has commanded it."

A voice was saying: "Call out!"

And another said, "What should I call out?"

All flesh is grass; all its loyalty is like the flowers of the field.

The grass dries up and the flower withers when the Lord's breath blows on it. Surely the people are grass.

The grass dries up; the flower withers, but our God's word will exist forever.

Go up on a high mountain, messenger Zion!

Raise your voice and shout, messenger Jerusalem!

Raise it; don't be afraid; say to the cities of Judah, "Here is your God!"

Here is the Lord God, coming with strength, with a triumphant arm, bringing his reward with him and his payment before him.

Like a shepherd, God will tend the flock; he will gather lambs in his arms and lift them onto his lap. He will gently guide the nursing ewes.

THE GOSPEL: Mark 1.1-8 (CEB)

Presider The Holy Gospel according to Mark.

People Praise and glory to God.

The beginning of the good news about Jesus Christ, God's Son, happened just as it was written about in the prophecy of Isaiah:

Look, I am sending my messenger before you.

He will prepare your way, a voice shouting in the wilderness: "Prepare the way for the Lord; make his paths straight."

John the Baptist was in the wilderness calling for people to be baptized to show that they were changing their hearts and lives and wanted God to forgive their sins. Everyone in Judea and all the people of Jerusalem went out to the Jordan River and were being baptized by John as they confessed their sins. John wore clothes made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist. He ate locusts and wild honey. He announced, "One stronger than I am is coming after me. I'm not even worthy to bend over and loosen the strap of his sandals. I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

The reader concludes This is the Gospel of Christ.

Leader We pray for the renewal of the Church in faith, love and service. We pray for bishops, ministers, and for the life of this community. We give thanks for the gift of your word, the grace of the sacraments and the fellowship of your people.

People Hear our prayer, O God.

Leader We pray for this local community and for all people in their daily life and work. We pray for the young and the elderly, for families, and all who are alone. We give thanks for human skill and creativity and all that reveals your loveliness.

People Hear our prayer, O God.

Leader We pray for all who suffer pain and loss; for those without housing, who are food insecure, and who experience addiction or mental illness.

We pray for victims of violence, war, and natural disaster, and for all in harm's way. We give thanks for the peacemakers and advocates who work to make the world whole.

People Hear our prayer, O God.

Leader We pray for those who are in need; for the sick, sorrowful and bereaved. We pray for all who bring comfort, care and healing. We give thanks for human love and friendship and for all that enriches our daily lives.

People Hear our prayer, O God.

Leader We especially pray for those on our prayer list, and for those we name silently or aloud.

(Silence)

We commend to God's mercy all who have died, especially those we name silently or aloud.

(Silence)

Let us commend ourselves, and all for whom we pray, to the mercy and love of God.

The Presider says

(Veronese Sacramentary)

God our rock and refuge: keep us safe in your care and strengthen us with your grace, that we may pray to you faithfully and love one another boldly, following the example of Jesus, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives for ever and ever. **Amen**.



Presider

In your love you made this world, you made us in your image, and you gave us hearts that yearn to seek after you; but time and time again we choose instead to seek after our own gain. You have called slaves, refugees, immigrants, the poor, and prisoners your own people and we have shunned them. You speak through the prophets to call us to your way of truth and justice and we ignore them. When you told Mary not to be afraid, she took it to heart, and so she carried you among us, pregnant with hope for a new world. Jesus, your own flesh and blood, gave the whole fullness of his life for all people. Even as we rejected his peace, he stretched out his arms to us in love and reconciliation.

On the night Jesus was betrayed, he took bread, and when he had given thanks he broke it, gave it to his disciples and said: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this to remember me.

After supper he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you. This is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sin. Do this as often as you drink it to remember me.

Therefore, God of all creation, with this bread and wine, we celebrate your great acts of liberation, ever present and living in Jesus Christ, crucified, risen, and coming again. Empower our celebration with your Holy Spirit: feed us with your life, fire us with your love, confront us with your justice, and make us one in the body of Christ.

Through Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Creator God.


The Breaking of the Bread

Come to this table, all who have much faith and all who would like to have more; all who have been here often and all who have not been for a long time; all who have tried to follow Jesus, and all who have failed; come. It is Christ who invites us to meet him here.

All are welcome to share in Holy Communion. After singing "Lamb of God" please be seated until invited by the ushers to move forward to stand or kneel at the altar.

To receive only a blessing, place arms in an "x" across your chest as the priest approaches.

To share the bread, extend hands open, palms up, one on top of the other.

To share the cup, take hold of the base and guide it to your mouth. If not desiring to receive the wine, fold arms in an "x" over your chest as the cup passes by.






