

WELCOME TO ST. MICHAEL'S!

We manifest joy through vibrant worship, beautiful music, and the active participation and nurturing of our children and youth.

We embrace resilience by learning each other's stories, proclaiming the Good News of God's unconditional love, and strengthening our capacity to hope.

We seek justice by advocating for political change, continuing our work as an Immigrant Welcoming Congregation, and striving to understand our role in social, economic, and racial inequality.

We are grounded in the Episcopal Church tradition, expressed from the creative perspective of our community. We are learning how to live into the bilingual and multicultural diversity of our congregation, and seeking silence and stillness to glean insight from the Holy Spirit among us.

St. Michael & All Angels, located in Multnomah County, rests on the traditional homelands of the Multnomah, Kathlamet, Clackamas, Molalla, Tumwater, Watlala bands of the Chinook, the Tualatin Kalapuya, and many other indigenous nations of the Columbia River. We acknowledge the ancestors of this place and understand that we are here because of the sacrifices forced upon them. By recognizing these communities, we honor their legacy, their lives, and their descendants. Episcopal worship gathers the hearts and prayers of everyone present and involves call and response between the leader and the assembly. You'll find the responses of the community here, in bold type, marked "People."

Children are welcome here, voices and wiggles and all! The very young (infants to five years) are invited to play in our childcare room on the lower level, though some children prefer to remain in worship with their families. Early in the service, school-age children (generally, grades K-5) will be invited downstairs for their Liturgy of the Word, and they return to the gathered community before Communion. Also, coloring and reading books for children are located at the back of the church.



THE SECOND READING


Lector A reading from Second Corinthians.

PRESENTATION AND EXAMINATION OF THE CANDIDATES

The Presider says

The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Then the candidate is presented individually by Parents and Godparents, saying

I present Anders Linden to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

The Presider then asks the parents and godparents

Will you be responsible for seeing that this child is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents and Godparents I will, with God's help.

Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

I will, with God's help.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

I will, with God's help.

Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord? I will, with God's help.

Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ? I will, with God's help.

Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself? I will, with God's help.

Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

I will, with God's help.

All stand as able

The Presider then addresses the congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in his life in Christ? *People* We will.

THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

The Presider then says

Let us join with these who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Presider	Do you believe in God the Father?
People	I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
Presider People	 Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God? I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
Presider People	Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
Presider People	Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God? I renounce them.
Presider	Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?
People	I renounce them.
Presider People	Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God? I renounce them.
Presider People	Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior? I do.
Presider People	Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love? I do.
Presider People	Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord? I do.

PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATE

The Presider then says to the congregation

Let us now pray for Anders, who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth, responding with, "Hear our prayer, O God."

A Person appointed leads the following petitions

- *Leader* Deliver Anders, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.
- People Hear our prayer, O God.
- *Leader* Open his hearts to your grace and truth.
- *People* Hear our prayer, O God.
- *Leader* Fill him with your holy and life-giving Spirit.
- People Hear our prayer, O God.
- *Leader* Keep him in the faith and communion of your holy Church.
- *People* Hear our prayer, O God.
- *Leader* Teach him to love others in the power of the Spirit.
- People Hear our prayer, O God.
- *Leader* Send him into the world in witness to your love.
- People Lord, hear our prayer.
- *Leader* Bring him to the fullness of your peace and glory.
- *People* Lord, hear our prayer.
- *Presider* Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. Amen.

Water is then poured into the font

THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

- The Presider blesses the water, first saying God be with you.
- *People* And also with you.
- Presider Let us give thanks to God.
- *People* It is right to give our thanks and praise.

The Presider continues

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life. We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Presider touches the water

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. Amen.

THE BAPTISM

The Priest pours water upon the candidate's head, saying Anders, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Then, the Priest anoints and places a hand on the person's head, saying Anders, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. Amen.

Then, the Priest presents the candidate with a lighted candle, saying Anders, receive the light of Christ, and shine forth as Christ's light in the world. Amen.

The Priest then prays over them, saying

Let us pray.


All Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain Anders, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. Amen.

The Presider then says

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

The newly-baptized then processes throughout the assembly as a hymn is sung.





Presider Holy and gracious God: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and maker of all.

Jesus stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Savior Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith.

All Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, Almighty God, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling Christ's death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in Christ. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through Jesus Christ our Savior. By Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and for ever. AMEN.

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD


The Presider breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept.



THE INVITATION

The Presider says The gifts of God for the People of God.

All are welcome to share in Holy Communion. Please be seated until invited by the Ushers to move forward to stand or kneel at the altar. To receive only a blessing, place arms in an "x" across your chest as the priest approaches. To share the bread, extend hands open, palms up, one on top of the other. To share the cup, take hold of the base and guide it to your mouth. If not desiring to receive the wine, fold arms in an "x" over your chest as the cup passes by.
