Episcopal worship gathers the hearts and prayers of everyone present and involves call and response between the leader and the assembly. Children are welcome here, voices and wiggles and all! During our 9:00, 11:00, and 1:00 services, the very young (infants to five years) are invited to play in our childcare room on the lower level, though some children prefer to remain in worship with their families. During those services, school-age children (generally, grades K-5) will be invited downstairs for their Liturgy of the Word, and they return to the gathered community before Communion. Coloring and reading books for children are always located at the back of the church for your child's enjoyment.
