A FORUM SERIES ON PREPARING FOR THE LATE SEASON & END OF LIFE

SUNDAYS, FEB 22 - MAR 22 | 10:15^{am}

NATIVITY HALL

In the Burial Office of the Book of Common Prayer, we proclaim that in death "life is changed, not ended." This Lenten forum series invites us to take that proclamation seriously—not only at the moment of death, but throughout the later seasons of life that lead toward it. Rooted in a theology of creation, incarnation, and resurrection, these five weeks explore the biological, theological, legal, financial, and liturgical dimensions of dying and death. Together, we will reflect on how Christian hope does not deny grief, how preparation can be an act of love, and how attending carefully to life's ending can deepen our capacity to bless beauty throughout all the seasons of life and even in that crossing over to death.

AFTER ATTENDING, an optional week of available 60-minute appointments with either Rev. Scott or Padre Toni, for personal discussion and funeral planning, will be made available during the Easter season.

SING WITH US!

St. Michael's music program consists of three non-auditioned choirs in English, and one musical group in Spanish.

THE ST. MICHAEL'S SINGERS is a our main adult choir that supports the Sunday morning services every week (except in summer), rehearsing each week and singing a wide variety of repertoire from Renaissance polyphony to gospel spirituals and classic Anglican anthems. Rehearsals are on Wednesday evenings at 7 pm.

THE SAINTS & SINGERS is for those wanting less of a commitment. The Saints & Singers rehearse and sing once or twice a month, offering accessible folk and world music anthems with a more informal atmosphere. Rehearsals are one Thursday a month.

THE ST. MICHAEL'S CHORISTERS train our youngest singers (3rd grade and up), rehearsing most weeks during the school year, with several opportunities to sing with our adult choirs. Rehearsals are on Sundays at 12:15 pm.

Liturgical ministries include offering the chalice as a **Eucharistic Minister**, guiding our ritual actions as a **Crucifer** or **Acolyte**, reading from Scripture as a **Lector** or leading prayers of the people as a **Prayer Leader**. If you're more of a "behind the scenes" person, consider joining a team on **Altar Guild** to prepare the altar for worship (once or twice per month), helping run the **A/V system**, or baking bread for a weekend (recipes provided). **Ushers** offer a warm welcome and hospitality each time we gather.
